

## Course Information:

### Dates and Time:

January 5 through April 6, 2011. There will be 13 class sessions. All classes will be held from 6 pm to 9 pm. All classes are on Wednesday evenings. If needed, make-up dates for weather cancellations will be arranged.

### Location:

The Donald F. Jones Auditorium of the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station, in New Haven, CT.

### Fees:

\$300. Payment must be made or a Purchase Order received in advance of the first class. Please fill out the attached enrollment form and mail it, along with a check, to the CTPA office at the address given on the form.

### Class Size:

The class will be limited to 40 students, on a first paid, first served basis. Town employees may reserve a place by sending a P.O. Those not admitted into this class will be placed on a waiting list for the next class, to be held beginning in September 2011.

*Traveling North:* Take Exit 61, Whitney Avenue. Take a left off of the exit and go south about 4 miles, staying on Whitney Avenue. An A-frame Presbyterian Church is on the corner of Whitney Ave. and Huntington Street. Take a right. The Experiment Station is approximately 1/4 mile on the right. Look for signs to the Jones Auditorium.

*Traveling South:* Take Exit 61, Whitney Avenue. Take a right off of the exit and go south about 4 miles, staying on Whitney Avenue. An A-frame Presbyterian Church is on the corner of Whitney Ave. and Huntington Street. Take a right. The Experiment Station is approximately 1/4 mile on the right. Once on the Station grounds, look for signs to the Jones Auditorium.

From Interstate 91

*Traveling North or South:* Take Exit 3, Trumbull Street. At the end of the ramp, follow Trumbull Street west (go straight) for two blocks, to Whitney Avenue. Take a right onto Whitney Avenue and head north for about 1-1/4 miles. An A-frame Presbyterian Church is on the corner of Whitney Ave. and Huntington Street. Take a left. The Experiment Station is approximately 1/4 mile on the right. Look for signs to the Jones Auditorium.

This course is intended to provide the successful graduate with the basic information essential to a career in arboriculture. Students who attend class, read the assigned materials and work with the instructors can also expect to do well on Connecticut's Arborist Licensing Exam. However, the course's main goal is to provide that foundation that will assist individuals as they move forward in a career in arboriculture.

In order to get the most from the course, students must make a commitment to studying. They must spend the time and effort needed to learn the covered material. Readings are assigned in advance of each class. Students are expected to complete these reading assignments.

The instructors are drawn from throughout Connecticut's tree care industry. Also included are several scientists from the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station. This variety in instruction is one of the key strengths of the course.

Please note - CTPA does not administer the Arborist Exam. That is done independently by the Department of Environmental Protection and the Tree Protection Examining Board. However, CTPA works closely with both groups to ensure that the material delivered in this course is appropriate to the exam.
